What happens at a *JOURNEY OF GENEROSITY?*



A Journey of Generosity is a **small group** retreat that focuses on the joy of living generously. It includes stories of generous givers, interactive **discussions**, **reflection** opportunities and **bible study** that enable participants to process the biblical message of generosity. It is story driven and experiential in nature.
